William Irvine's Last Will and Testament

The following documents were provided to *Telling the Truth* in 2013 containing the Last Will and Testament of William Irvine, the founder of the movement which later split into the Two-by-Two, Cooneyite and Message sects. Irvine died in March 1947 and his Will was executed during the chaotic days when Britain was hurriedly withdrawing from its Mandate of Palestine. The first (below) is the cover letter from the archivist which accompanied the documents provided by the British court.

If you wish to make any further searches please note the search fee is £6 for a search. Each extra copy of the same document ordered at the same time will attract an additional fee of £1.00. The fee covers a 4-year search starting from the year in which the death occurred (or the year from which you ask us to start searching). Longer searches are charged at the rate of £4.00 per 4-year period, so that an 8-year search will cost £10.00, and a 12-year search £14.00. Cheques should also be made payable to 'H.M. 

This document records registration of the Will and appointment of Barclays Bank as the administrator of provisions of the Will on behalf of Theodore Krikorian (the executor). The value of the funds granted for Krikorian's use in England was £1410.5.11 (it is not known whether this includes amounts bequeathed outside of England, though apparently it may not, as "Great Britain" was crossed-out and "England" was written instead), until the probate was finalized.

To estimate the 2013 value of amounts in British Pounds, multiply by 32. For a quick approximation of amounts in 2013 U.S. Dollars, multiply by 48.

IW THE METTER OF: The Will of WILLIAM IRVIVE DECEASED.

ORDER.

Bs it known that on the 21st day of April, in the year 1947, the last Will dated 27the Jenuary, 1947, a copy of which is attached hereto, of WILLIAM IRVINE, deceased, who died in Jeruselsm, on the 9th day of March, 1947, was proved and registered in the District Court, Jerusalem, and that administration of all singular the movable property and mulk immovable property and miri immovable property of the said figgssed in Palestine was granted by the aforesaid Court to Mr. THEODORE KRIKORIAN, the executor named in the said will, the said Theodore Krikorian having been first sworn well and faithfully to administer the same by paying the just debts of the deceased and the legacis contained in the said Will so far as he is thereunto bound by Law, and to exhibit a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the said property and to render a just and true account whenever required by Law to do so.

 This Will specifies the distribution of £2,200 (equivalent to £70,400 in 2013 £). This would have been worth approximately \$10,000 in 1947 US\$ (equivalent to \$105,600 in 2013 US\$). The average U.S. house sold in 1947 cost \$13,000 and the average annual salary was \$3,500 (in 1947 US\$). Some of the named beneficiaries still exist and others would have shut down or moved shortly thereafter upon the liquidation of the British Mandate of Palestine the next year. As Irvine was already extremely ill at the time the Will was set down, the bequests likely are based upon his liquid cash in Pounds and may not factor in other securities, currencies, accounts, etc. in his possession at the time of his death.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

WILLIAM IRVIWE, born in Kilsyth, Scotland on the 7the day of January 1863, a resident of Jerusalem, Palestine, being of sound mind and knowledge hereby revoke all former Wills and testamentary dispositions made by me, and by this my last Will devise and bequeath all my movable and immovable property and my real and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever situated, as follows:sum of LP. 200.- (Two hundred Palestine Pounds) to WELLIE CLELAND, my sister, wife of David Cleland, residing in Kirkintilloch, Scotland, or to her heirs, or legal personal representatives. (2) The sum of LP. 200.— (Two hundred Falestine Pounds) to JENNIE CLELAND, my other sister, wife of Peter Cleland, residing in Kilsyth, Scotland, or to her heirs, or legal personal representatives. (3) The sum of LP. 500. - (Five hundred Palestine Pounds) to the Radium Institute of the Hadassah University Hospital for a bed to be endowed in the name of WILLIAM IRVINE, Kilsyth, Scotland. (4) The sof LP. 150.- (One Hundred and Fifty Palesting Pounds) to (4) The sum St. John's Ophtalmic Hospital, Jerusalem. (8) The sum (8) The sum of LP. 50 .- (Fifty Palestine Pounds) to The People's Dispensary for Sick Animals of the poor, at Birket-El-Sultan, Jerusalem. (9) The sum of LP. 500.- (Five hundred Palestine Pounds). my friend Mr. THOMAS COUSSEN, Greed Colony, Jerusalem. (10) The sum of LP. 100.- (One hundred Palestine Founds) to Dr. T. MIWASSIAN, Jerusalem. (11) The sum of LP. 100.- (One hundred Palestine Pounds) to the Staff (excluding the management) of the Almasia Hotel, Jerusalam. (12) The sum of LP. 50.-(Fifty Palestine Pounds) in equal shares, to the two proprietors of the Almasia Hotel, Jerusalem. (13) Clothes and all other chattles in my room to be collected and given away to the poor and needy as decided by my executor and Mr. Thomas Coussin. (14) The residue of my estate to be distributed to institutions for the poor and needy in Jerusalem as decided by my executor and Mr. Thomas Couesin. (15) All funeral arrangements and last sacred rites to be arranged by my beloved friend Mr. Thomas Coussin, who will see to all matters in this respect and charge the expenses incurred to the estate. (16) I appoint Mr. THEODORE KRIKORIAN, of Upper Baga, Jemusalem (now Senior Paymaster Police) to be the sole executor of this my last will, the sold executor to sell, call in and convert all my movebase property real and personal estate whatsoever and wherescever situated into money to be distributed according to the provisions and bequests hereinbefore contained. I fix hereby the sum of LP. 100.- (One hundred Palestine Pounds) to be paid to my said executor. IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereuato set my hand this 27the day of January, One Thousand Mine Hundred & Forty -Seven. (Sgd.) William Irvine. On 100 mils Revenue Stamp. Signed by the above mestator as his last Will in the joint presence of himself and us, who at his request and in such joint presence have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses. (Sgd.) B.
